




# Do you support making Reedley College including Madera Community College Center and Oakhurst Community College Center smoke-free?


#### Smoke-free MOR: Summarizing written responses (both online and written)

A total of 421 comments were quantified, there were 499 total written responses in support of and against:


- **78** (16%) responses were not quantified because they cannot be categorized, examples include:
