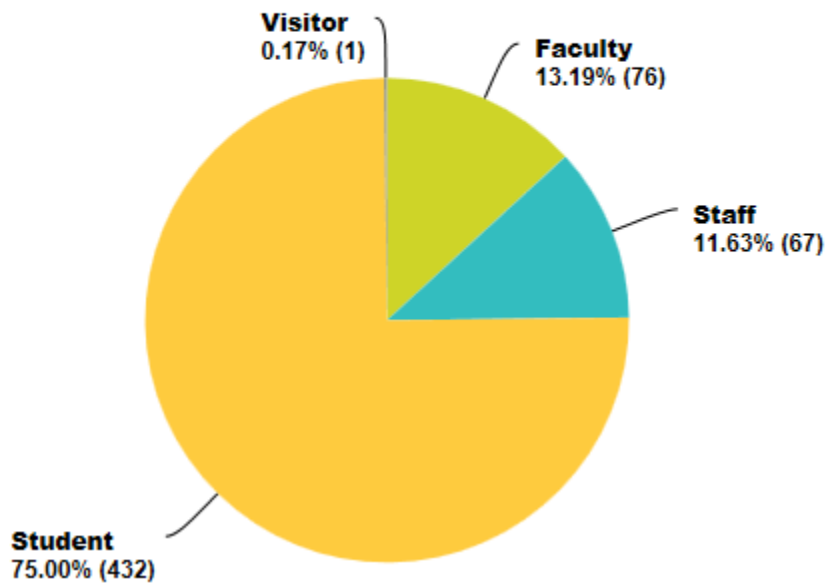

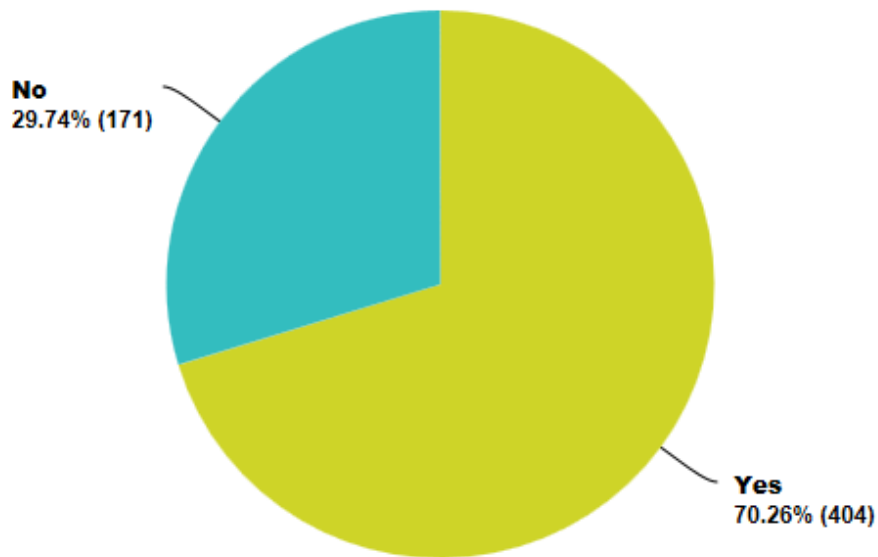

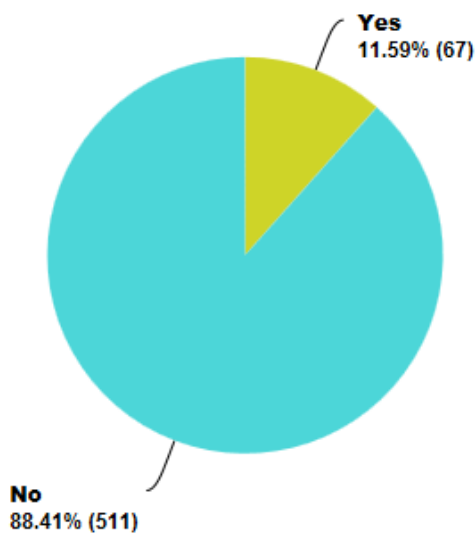
Do you support making Reedley College including Madera Community College Center and Oakhurst Community College Center smoke-free?

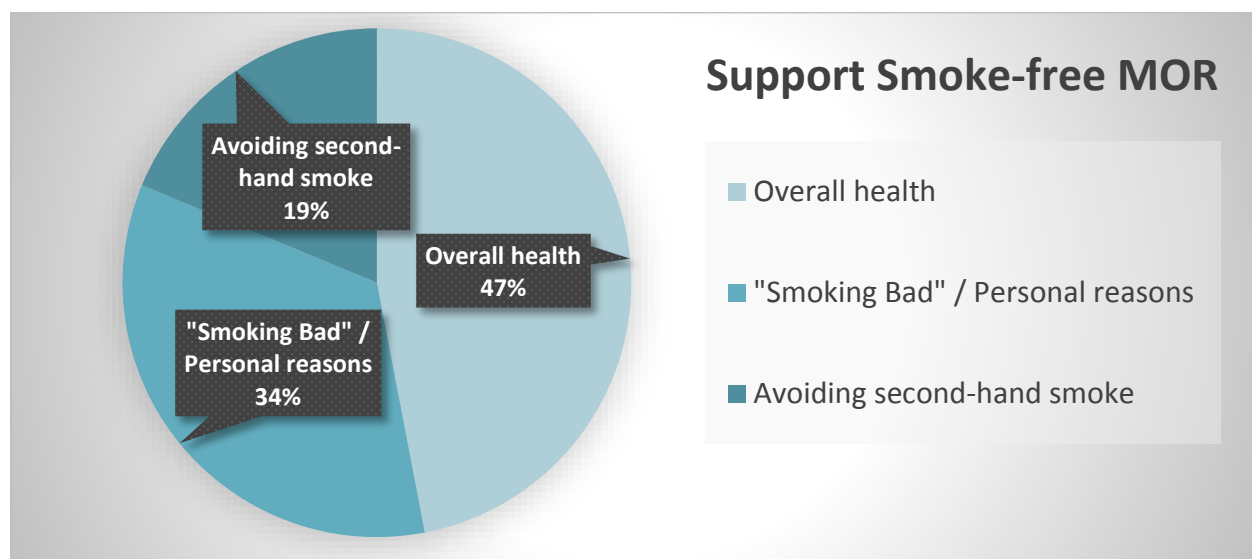
Smoke-free MOR: Summarizing written responses (both online and written)

Question: “Please tell us why you support or do not support making Reedley College including all centers, smoke free campuses.”

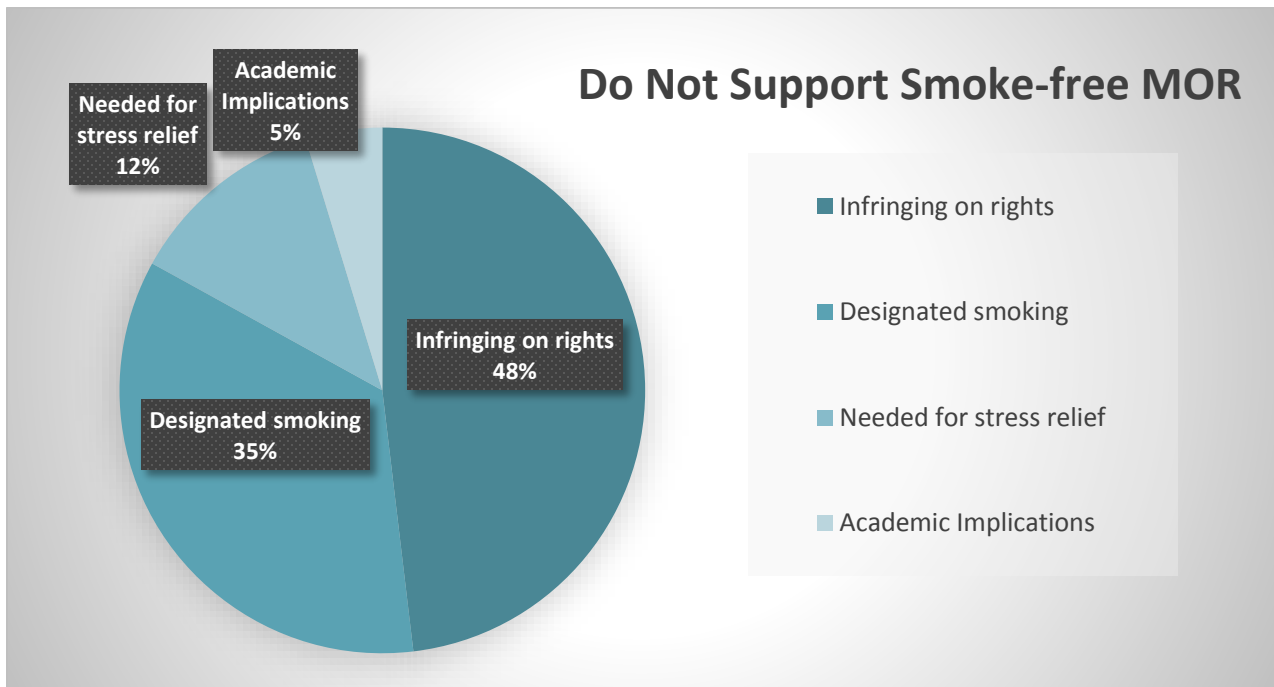
A total of 421 comments were quantified, there were **499** total written responses in support of and against:

- **78** (16%) responses were not quantified because they cannot be categorized, examples include:
 - “Indifferent”
 - “We are adults”
 - “It doesn’t matter”

Reasons <i>'in support'</i> of smoke-free MOR	# of Responses
Overall Health (including clean air)	47% (148)
“Smoking Bad”/Personal Reasons Personal reasons include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “Don’t want to smell smoke”/“Smells bad” • “Daycare on campus” • Lost a family member to smoking-related disease 	34% (108)
Avoiding second-hand smoke	19% (59)

Reasons ' <i>not in support</i> ' of smoke-free MOR	# of Responses
Infringing on my/others rights	48% (51)
Should keep designated smoking areas	35% (37)
Needed for stress relief	12% (13)
Academic implications; tardiness and absenteeism due to leaving campus to smoke	5% (5)

Question: “The College is working to obtain smoking cessation kits, and will also provide links to resources on the website. How else can the college help to make this process an easier transition?”

68 (30%) comments were quantified, there were **227** total written responses:

- **159 (70%)** responses were not quantified because they do not respond to the question, examples include:
 - “No easy answer”
 - “No.”
 - “I Don’t Know”

How can the college help to make this process an easier transition?	# of Responses
Education, signage and additional social marketing such as events (In regards to both <i>policy</i> <u>and</u> <i>negative effects of tobacco use</i>)	50% (34)
Support Group/Counseling	24% (16)
Policing/Enforcement	19% (13)
Nicotine Gum available/oral fixation snacks	6% (4)
Physical activity/socializing breaks	1% (1)
