STATE CHAMPIONS!

Our men's golf team took home the state championship title at Dragonfly Golf Club in Madera with an impressive and dominant performance. The Tigers (711 team score) finished at -19, which is the lowest score in program and state championship tournament history. Elias Pettersson (72, 67) finished at -7 (139) to earn state-runner up honors. Congratulations to Head Coach Scott Stark, Assistant Coach John Perkins and the team on an incredible season! This is our first state championship since 2016 and the second in program history, both under Coach Stark (2016, 2023).
