HERE WE GROW AGAIN!

The third groundbreaking event on campus in the past two years will take place tomorrow morning, as the ceremonial shoveling of dirt will mark the official start of construction of the McClarty Center for Fine and Performing Arts. Guest speakers include SCCCD Chancellor Dr. Carole Goldsmith, RC President Dr. Jerry Buckley, SCCCD Board Trustee Magdalena Gomez and Bob Petithomme of Darden Architects, as well as performances by our music and choir students. The new facility is approximately 25-thousand square feet and includes a 509 seat performance hall, box office, concession stand, office, restrooms, art gallery, storage areas, green room, and large lobby area for gathering space. "We cannot wait to usher in a new and exciting chapter of fine arts education for our students, and we look forward to recognizing our donors, elected officials and the communities that are responsible for making this amazing resource possible," said RC President Dr. Jerry Buckley. Completion of the project is set for June of 2023.

Men's golf won the Van Sweet Invitational in Stockton February 22, firing a 390 to defeat seven teams from Northern California. And our men's basketball team defeated Fresno City 75-71 February 16 for their only win in conference play this season.
