# BOARD REPORT

#### **RURAL GUIDED PATHWAYS INSTITUTE**

Reedley College participated in their second Rural Guided Pathways institute from October 18th through October 21st in Cheyenne, Wyoming. A cohort of sixteen rural colleges analyzed and discussed these colleges' data to identify strengths and weaknesses in student outcomes for each college, specifically assessing the frequency of students that



completed high wage, moderate wage and low wage programs of study. Included in the Reedley team was a representative of the Fresno Workforce Investment Board (WIB). A distinguishing feature of this rural college cohort's work is the inclusion of industry partners with each college team, where a variety of minds and voices help the college analyze their work and determine new opportunities to better serve our communities and students of all ages.

## **NEW GRANT AWARD TO BENEFIT RC STEM**

Reedley College was awarded a Developing Hispanic-Serving Institutions Title V grant for the FY 2022 grant competition from the U.S. Department of Education. The United in Diversifying Our Students (UNIDOS) in STEM project will seek to increase the number of first generation Hispanic and low-income students who enroll, complete, and transfer in STEM degree pathways. Funding will



support STEM outreach, wrap-around case management, improved lab spaces and equipment, curriculum development, and a Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) program which will further support underrepresented students to excel

in STEM fields. "I would like to thank all the faculty and staff that made this grant award possible by their hard work in serving our students and ensuring that students who want to pursue a STEM career have the best support to reach their dreams and goals," said RC Dean of Instruction Juan Bedolla. The total funding of three-million dollars for this award will be received over five years (\$600-thousand/year).

Darla is majoring in Aviation Maintenance Technology and is obtaining her Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Airframe and Powerplant certificates through the program as well.
