ASG REPORT

Our Associated Student Government hit the ground running to start the Fall 2023 semester, participating in numerous events, holding multiple meetings and swearing in new officers.

- ASG participated in a training session hosted by the Student Senate for California Community Colleges at Madera Community College August 4. They learned about the SSCCC, meeting procedures, student engagement and the student 9+1 rights.
- ASG attended and participated in Tiger Preview. President Dejalia Borquez served on the student panel and spoke on campus clubs and engagement to the incoming freshmen.
- Student Trustee Jerry Reyes attended the 2023 Student Trustee
 Workshop hosted by the Community College League of California in
 Riverside, CA August 4-6. He represented Reedley College and the
 SCCCD as well as the SSCCC. Trustee Reyes learned the importance
 of his role as a Student Trustee on the Board of Trustees and how to
 represent the student voice in supporting current community needs
 and anticipating future educational trends.
- ASG participated in Welcome Week. They held a booth to give out snacks and school supplies as well as promoting campus clubs and resources to students. They also assisted students with any questions and directed them to their classes.
- The Inter-Club Council held their first meeting of the 2023-24 academic year. The turnout was great for the first meeting and they went through an ICC 101 training led by Student Trustee Reyes. They learned about what ICC is and their responsibilities as campus club leaders.
- ASG held their first meeting of the 2023-24 academic year. They had the privilege of being sworn in by President Buckley.
