## **NEW AG TECH DIRECTOR**



Dr. Kaomine Vang brings his 16 years of experience in leadership, program development and research to Reedley College to serve as the first Agrifood Technology & Engineering Collaborative (AgTEC) Innovation Center Director. The AgTEC Innovation Center will house agriculture technology startups businesses, which will provide students throughout the region with hands on work experience. The

Center will also be a conduit to educated and train skilled personnel focusing on addressing critical issues in agriculture and assist in the research and development of new essential technologies in agriculture production systems. "We are in an exciting time where technology touches everything," Dr. Vang said. "Agriculture is a frontier where we will see growth in the use of different technologies such as automation and robotics. I am excited to have this opportunity to be part of a program and center which provides opportunities for our agriculture students in learning new innovative technologies and practices." Previously, Dr. Vang was the Program Director for the Advanced Pumping Efficiency Program (APEP) for the Center for Irrigation Technology (CIT) at Fresno State. He graduated in May 2016 with a Doctorate in Educational Leadership from Fresno State, and has a Bachelors and Master of Science Degree in Industrial Technology.
