He is a first-generation student that attended Oxnard College after high school and transferred to the University of California Irvine to obtain his bachelor's degree in History with an emphasis in Mexican History. He continued his education at California State University Northridge where he obtained his master's degree in Chicana/o Studies and his doctoral degree in Educational Leadership. During that time, he and his wife were fortunate to start their family and have two daughters. "I am excited to begin on this journey as the new Vice President of Student Services for Reedley College," Dr. Vega said. "I look forward to the opportunity to contribute to the growth and success of our diverse student body. I invite everyone to join me in providing excellent service, developing innovative programs and resources that will promote inclusivity and meet the needs of our students. I am honored to be one of the leaders of this Hispanic Serving Institution that will lead it to its next 100 years." For the 7th time in RC history and the 3rd time since 2018, our Agriculture Department is the winner of the Outstanding Post-Secondary Program Award from the California Agriculture Teachers Association (CATA). Members of the department and administration attended the awards ceremony in San Luis Obispo June 28. The Outstanding Postsecondary Agriculture Program Award recognizes exemplary postsecondary institutions and full-time young farmer and adult agriculture education programs. UPWARD BOUND SUMMER CAMP

This summer, Upward Bound is hosting over 220 students from 12 high schools. This TRIO college prep program serves first generation college going students from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds and offers summer elective classes such as English, Science, Animal Science, Sports Medicine, Nursing, VEX



Robotics, Seaperch Robotics, Foreign Language, College Life, Computer Literacy, and more. Students get to stay at the Residence Hall for two weeks to experience the dorm life. Students also receive tutorial support, a stipend, school supplies, food, transportation, academic counseling, college/university field trips, and more. Additionally, 72 of those students



are enrolled in college classes through High School Enrichment. Furthermore, the program trained and placed over 74 rising high school seniors in stipend based internships and externships with community partners as well as on campus sites.

STEM CAMP

A summer STEM Camp will be held at Reedley College from July 24-28 for students in 5th grade and higher. Participates will enjoy learning about topics in science, engineering, and computer science. Each day students will also have a team building activity.





CAMP BANQUET

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) held its celebration banquet June 9. The event recognizes our first cohort of CAMP students' achievements and completion of their first year of college. RC Mentors, and RC Faculty/Staff efforts for achieving program goals were also acknowl-

edged. Families, counselors, professors, administrative staff were invited. The banquet promotes social and emotional support, recognition of academic success, and the efforts to learn how to navigate college, as they continue into their second year of college and beyond. CAMP was established at RC in July of 2022. It serves 60 students



per year (cohort-based). The program is designed to help first-generation students from a migrant farm working background (agricultural), assist first-time freshman students during their first-year in college to successfully complete their freshman year at Reedley College.
