WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT REEDLEY COLLEGE

- President Dr. Sandra Caldwell: Ed.D. in supervision, curriculum, and instruction in higher education with emphasis in community colleges, from Texas A&M University-Commerce, a master's degree in statistics and a bachelor's in mathematics education from Oklahoma State University.
- Students manage an 800-acre forest at Lake Sequoia and a 300 acre-farm, the largest California community college farm
- Aviation Maintenance students work in a 20,000 sq. ft. hangar.
- Ranked #2 in campus safety in California
- One of only 11 California community college campuses with a Residence Hall
- Students have the benefit of free resources including the Student Center, Math Study Center, Writing Center, Tutorial Center, Veterans Center, and Career Resource Center.
- The Entrepreneurship Center opened in October of 2012 as a resource for students and the community. It is supported by the Reedley Rotary, the Reedley Chamber of Commerce, and the Fresno State Lyles Center.
- Agri-business students produce, market and sell college olive oil.
- Pete P. Peters Honors Program that includes small classes taught by top RC instructors, field trips, priority registration, special transfer counseling, guaranteed transfer agreements with top California universities, Honors recognition at entrance and exit, and a stipend.
- The campus sits on the Kings River and connects to Parkway Trails
- Affordable at \$46 a unit, with financial aid available to those that qualify
- 55 degrees, 49 Certificate of Achievements, 30 Certificates, and guarantee transfer agreements to 4-year colleges/universities are offered
- Ten athletic teams: football, volleyball, men's & women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's & women's tennis, men's & women's golf
- Reedley Middle College High School, a unique high school with an emphasis on business administration or agriculture business

The Madera Community College Center and the Oakhurst Community College Center are centers of Reedley College:

- The Oakhurst Center serves the foothill communities, approximately 500 students, and offers general education classes.
- The Madera College Advantage Program (MCCAP) program is designed to help high school seniors transition from high school to having a successful college experience
- The Madera Center Honors Program provides students an opportunity to be challenged with rigorous transfer curriculum to prepare them to apply for admissions at highly competitive four-year universities
- The Madera Center and Reedley College are developing an LVN-RN Step-Up program that are cohort based. It takes one summer session and two semesters to complete the program that prepares students to pass the NCLEX board exam. Madera proposes that a minimum of 90% of these students will earn their RN licenses.
